¹ Fees for the Single 6 month course are for students who enrol for either the January to June course or the July to December course for the first time.

² Fees for the Return 6 month course are for students who return to enrol in the next available 6 month course after studying on a single 6 month course.

TERMS AND CONDITIONS OF GMC FEES AND CHARGES

1. COURSE FEES

- Course fees cover tuition, examinations, trips (see below) and use of the School's facilities for the duration of the course. Two courses are run each year, from January to June and from July to December. The course fees are compulsory and payable by all students. The School reserves the right to increase the published fees at any time without prior notice.
- Students who enrol for the GMC 6 month course for the first time, pay the Single Course fee. Students who choose to return for a further 6 month course pay the lower, Return Course fees.
- The School organises one Vision Trip per course. Course fees cover the associated travel and accommodation costs. All personal costs for the Vision Trip, and all other travel and personal costs are the responsibility of the student.
- In the event that a student withdraws from the course after the course has started, no refund of course fees will be given, and the student will remain liable for the full amount of the course fees.

2. ACCOMMODATION & MEAL CHARGES

- Accommodation charges cover the shared occupancy of a study room during the duration of the course. This period of occupancy runs from the GMC course start date and ends on the last day of the course.
- Additional accommodation outside of these periods is discretionary on the part of the School, and subject to availability, pre-booking and pre-payment. This must always be within the period of the student's permission to live and study in the UK as granted by the student's visa or other UK entry documentation. Charges for any additional accommodation are shown under Additional Charges.
- In the event that a student decides to vacate the accommodation after the start of the period of occupancy, no refund of charges will be given, and the student will remain liable for the full amount of the accommodation charges.
- A room deposit of £50 is payable on arrival to secure the accommodation, and students are required to sign a tenancy agreement for each period of occupancy. The £50 deposit is refundable at the end of the final period of occupancy, subject to the room and its

furniture being returned in a clean, tidy and undamaged condition. The School reserves the right to withhold all or part of the deposit to pay for cleaning or damage.

- Meal charges cover lunches and evening meals for 7 days per week for the entire period of the course. Additional charges apply to meals taken at any other times, and are subject to pre-booking and pre-payment, and subject to availability.
- In the event that a student chooses not to eat all or some of the meals provided by the School, no refund will be given and the student will remain liable for the full amount of the meal charges shown.

3. PAYMENT OF FEES AND CHARGES

- Students will be invoiced for course fees, residential accommodation and meal charges before the start of the course. Fees are payable in full on receipt of the invoice.
- Where a student is sponsored by a third party (E.G. church, trust, family, friend), it is the student's responsibility to make arrangements for such payments to the School and at all times remains responsible for the payment of all fees should any expected support fail to materialise.
- Where fees and charges are not paid as required, the School reserves the right to withhold tuition, accommodation and meals until any outstanding dues are paid, and to refuse the student permission to take examinations and complete the course.
